**MOTOR SPORTS COUNCIL NATIONAL COURT

The National Court has considered the Eligibility Appeal of Joshua Jackson following his exclusion from the BRSCC Mazda MX5 Championship Race at Anglesey Circuit on 6th August 2017.

Following the conclusion of Race 2a the car driven by Mr Jackson, competition No.72, was subject to measurement of the engine power output.

Six tests were conducted and on the final test the power output was said to be 105.51 horsepower. The Championship Regulations specify that the maximum output should not exceed 105.

Mr Jackson entered a valid written Notice of Intention to Appeal at 12.35pm and paid the relevant fee.

He complied with the procedure set out in General Regulation C7.2.1(a) but it appears that the Chief Scrutineer was not notified of this fact by the Clerk of the Course or the Secretary of the Meeting as required by General Regulation C7.2.1 (b).

Subsequently Mr Jackson submitted his detailed reasons for appealing as required by C7.2.1 (C) but no response has ever been received from the Scrutineer.

Accordingly this Appeal is upheld. The Appeal fee is to be refunded and his exclusion under General Regulation C3.5.1 overturned.

The results are to be amended accordingly.

The National Court very much regrets the breakdown in communications that has led to the present situation and strongly recommends that the procedures be reviewed.
