

# Rescue Unit / Stage Safety Unit (SSU) Equipment Checking Guidance for Motorsport UK Stewards / Club Stewards

It is a Motorsport UK requirement that Rescue Units and SSUs at events are checked by the Motorsport UK Steward (or their nominated Deputy) to ensure that the vehicle is not only equipped correctly but that the equipment carried is 'in date'. The following guidance notes have been developed to assist you in this task by illustrating the equipment and where to identify its certification or expiry date.

Should any Rescue Unit / SSU not meet the equipment standards detailed in the Motorsport UK Yearbook (Section F, Emergency and Medical Services) please discuss this directly with the unit's Crew Chief and ensure an observation is made in the Stewards report for onward reporting to Motorsport UK. Following an inspection please ensure that you sign the vehicles unit check sheet, commenting as appropriate.


### **Medical Equipment**

Generally the expiry date is indicated by the use of the following symbol and the date next to it:




### **AED and Pads**



With AEDs it is also recommended that you check their battery status – the Unit's Crew Chief will be able to assist you in this task.






### Rescue Equipment (Mechanical)

Whilst there is no expiry date on mechanical equipment it should be checked for its general condition. Where hydraulic cutting gear is carried it should be inspected for its general condition. If the vehicle carries a hydraulic servicing certificate (not mandatory for it to be carried) it should be checked to ensure the equipment is 'in date' for annual servicing.

Fire Extinguishers should be checked to ensure they have been subject to an annual check:



#### **Vehicle's General Condition**

The Motorsport UK yearbook states that all units and equipment are to be of appropriate specification and kept serviceable, clean, tidy and in a hygienic condition. Should you feel that this is not the case then you are advised to discuss this directly with the unit's Crew Chief and, if necessary, ensure an observation is made in the Stewards report for onward reporting to Motorsport UK.
