J2019/18 Khali Atkins – British Kart Championship Meeting – Sherington Kart Circuit – 12 May 2019

This matter came before the National Court as a Disciplinary case following events at Sherington Kart Circuit on 12 May within the British Kart Championship Event.

At the Event, the Stewards of the Meeting (i) disqualified Mr Khali Atkins from the Meeting and (ii) suspended Mr Atkins' licence for 30 days pursuant to GR C2.6.2 by for Abusive Language, Behaviour or Assault contrary to General Regulation C1.1.9.

The case was presented to the National Court by Mr Champkin (Motorsport UK's Disciplinary Officer) for the National Court to consider the imposition of a further penalty pursuant to GR C2.6.2.

Having reviewed video footage of the incident and heard representations from Mr Karl Atkins (PG licence holder) and his son Khali Atkins the Panel feel that there is no place in Motorsport for abusive language or behaviour resulting in assault under any circumstances.

The Panel note that Khali has served his thirty (30) day suspension, but in light of the above and the seriousness of the incident, order a further suspension of three (3) months to Khali Atkins licence, such additional suspension itself suspended until 1st January 2020. In the event that Khali Atkins receives a further penalty contrary to C1.1.9 before 1st January 2020, the additional three (3) month suspension shall become effective immediately.
