

How do I raise a Complaint

Clear reporting processes have been developed including the ability to upload the complaint and supporting evidence via an online form at: https://www.motorsportuk.org/racewithrespect/.

Your Club/Championship have a process to follow for any complaints received which includes registering the complaint on the Motorsport UK Race with Respect Reporting form. Both Club/Championship and the Motorsport UK handling processes are set out and available at https://www.motorsportuk.org/racewithrespect/

During the Event

The Code is to be championed by the Club/Championship who may nominate a Respect Officer however, your complaint or concern can be raised with any officer of the Club; Competition Secretary, Club Secretary or Championship Co-ordinator, a Clerk of the Course and/or Steward of the Meeting may also be your point of contact at the event.

It is imperative that this process runs parallel to the usual judicial process and not in place of it. For example, if there is a breach of behaviour during the Event this may be a breach of C.1.1.9. and a Decision issued by the Clerks of the Course/Stewards of the Meeting and parallel to that would be a Report issued for Conduct without Respect.

Any complaints should be officially submitted/logged in writing (if the complainant is not comfortable with putting this in writing the person receiving the complaint may do so on their behalf).

Post Meeting Complaints

If something arises outside the Event the matter should be reported to your Club/Championship although you can also register with Motorsport UK direct via the online reporting forms available here. As part of the management process Motorsport UK may raise the matter with and request investigation by the Organiser/Championship.

Can I register the Incident Anonymously?

Motorsport UK does provide for individual reports to be submitted anonymously however in these cases it will not be possible to respond. By submitting the detail it will enable us to gain valuable information and help to make the sport more accessible.
